The management would like to thank our teachers on the great job of evacuating the Center on December 16th when the City had a major natural gas leak. We were ordered by the Wetumpka Police Department and the Wetumpka Fire Department to evacuate the children by bus to First Baptist Church. We appreciate all the parents in their quick response to our calls to pick up their children. This made a safe departure for the Center. Good job for the safe and effective way that you carried out our Emergency Evacuation Plan. Please note that our normal evacuation shelter is the Wetumpka Police Department but the leak was too close to the Department and we were instructed to evacuate to the First Baptist Church. Even though the paper said some people were allowed to return to their homes by 10:30 A.M., we were instructed by the Emergency Management Agency to wait for several hours to make sure the repair held. As it was, the smell was very pervasive for hours. Safety for the children was our main concern. Thanks.
